**THIRD AMENDED STANDING ORDER**  
Misc No. 3:22-mc-00041-RBH

**THIRD AMENDED STANDING ORDER**

Due to the continuing and evolving COVID-19 national public health emergency and the availability of a vaccine, the Court finds it necessary and appropriate to further amend its June 3, 2021 Second Amended Standing Order (*see* Misc. No 3:21-mc-00330-RBH). This Order applies only to those entering on federal district and bankruptcy court business. The United States District Court for the District of South Carolina continues to closely monitor guidance issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and our local health authorities regarding the Covid-19 outbreak and bases this Order on that guidance and in consultation with Dr. Christine Carr of the Medical University of South Carolina.

Effective immediately, the following persons shall not enter any federal courthouse in the District of South Carolina:

1. Anyone, fully vaccinated, who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the previous five days.
2. Anyone not fully vaccinated who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the previous ten days.
3. Anyone who has had close contact with someone with COVID-19 within the previous ten days and (a) is unvaccinated, or (b) completed the primary series of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine more than six months ago and is not boosted, or (c) completed the Johnson & Johnson vaccine more than two months ago and is not boosted.
4. Anyone who is currently under a directive from a healthcare provider or state or local health authority to self-quarantine.
5. Anyone with any current symptom of COVID-19 identified by the CDC, including fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestions or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.

The United States Marshal, his Deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall deny entry to anyone attempting to enter in violation of this Order.

If you have a scheduled appointment or you are otherwise required to appear at one of the courthouses in the District of South Carolina, and you are unable to appear because of the restrictions listed above, you should proceed as follows:

If you are represented by an attorney, please contact your attorney;

If you are an attorney and you are scheduled to appear in court before a judge, please contact the chambers directly (contact information may be found on the court's website at [www.scd.uscourts.gov](http://www.scd.uscourts.gov));

If you are a juror, please contact the Jury Department at 803-253-3997;


