Ronnie graduated from St. Andrews College where he double majored in Chemistry and Philosophy. In college as a sprinter, he lettered in track 3 years, and was named Academic All-Conference in the Dixie Athletic Conference. Ronnie also served as a teaching assistant under Dr. Harry Harvin and was appointed as Assistant Director of Logistics for the St. Andrews College Sciences Laboratory. Ronnie successfully prosecuted on behalf of the government, the murder trial of UNITED STATES v. HERNANDEZ. He was appointed by the Department of Justice to serve as a Special Assistant, United States Attorney, and prosecuted numerous civilians for committing crimes on U.S. military installations.

Following his military service, Ronnie joined Clawson and Staubes. He initially worked in the Charleston office, and later moved to and opened the Charlotte office. Ronnie is licensed to practice law in Arkansas, North Carolina and South Carolina. He concentrates in complex and catastrophic injury and death cases, handling traumatic brain injuries, spinal cord injuries, burn cases, and quadriplegia. Ronnie has obtained defense verdicts in both NC and SC cases, involving claimed damages of \$300,000.00+
